A careful and calibrated approach is needed to care for both COVID-19 cases and the far majority facing hunger and other diseases.

Cost-benefit analysis of 2 weeks of MECQ or its equivalent



NCR hunger, poverty, and deaths from other diseases

Hungry people: 3.2 million + 58,000 more

**Unemployed people:** 506,000 + 128,500 more

Income loss: 2.1 billion in NCR and adjacent area for each day of MECQ

**Non-COVID deaths in 2019:** 78,599

Forgone treatment for high burden diseases: 75,000
