| | The Philippine furniture industry offers a diverse range of products which vary according to function, material, size, and utility. Home furniture is the most popular functional category among manufacturers. This product line includes dining, kitchen , living room, bedroom, patio, den, home entertainment centers, home offices, garden/outdoor furniture, among others. Most furniture products may also be classified as leg items such as beds, tables and chairs; case goods, including cabinets and chests of drawers or building and home fittings. Many firms produce furniture for institutional clients such as hotel, resorts, restaurants and offices. Some also provide products for retailers such as shelves, accessories for display windows, and other visual merchandising implements. Local furniture is made from a variety of materials. Wood is the most common material utilized in the industry as wooden furniture pieces, combining two or more materials such as wood and stone, wood and leather, stainless steel and abaca/bacbac, fiberglass and so on. Other materials which may be combined with traditional base material of wood, metal or rattan, include bamboo, sea shells, vines like agsam or nito, coconut, twigs, and even by-products of animals such as the inlay of bones and horns of carabaos, goats, cows, and the like. Non-traditional textiles such as katsa and sinamay (abaca) are also used for upholstery and coverings. | |
