Today is an important milestone as we witness the signing of the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) Signing between the Emirates Authority for Standardization and Metrology (UAE-ESMA) and the Department of Trade and Industry – Philippine Accreditation Bureau (DTI-PAB) and—

It is estimated that Muslims will make up more than a quarter of the world's population by 2030. The global Islamic market is projected to be worth over \$5 trillion by 2020 (https://qz.com/888830/the-worlds-fastest-growing-population-is-also-a-massively-untapped-food-and-fashion-market/). Imagine a group of more than 1 billion consumers with diverse tastes and interests, whose purchasing decisions are informed by the principles of Islamic law, underserved in the conventional marketplace yet eager to purchase goods that suit their particular lifestyle. Islam, after all, is meant to be a way of life, not just a series of practices and traditions, so the governing rules permeate every moment of a Muslim's day, from food to clothing, investments to insurance. And Muslims around the world are waiting for more suppliers to step up.

Imports of halal food of cooperating countries to this technical cooperation are seen to reach US\$53.1B by 2020 with UAE's annual food import expected to reach by the end of the decade (DTI Website). Through this partnership, we see an easing up of trade between United Arab Emirates and the Philippines particularly for Halal products through Halal accreditation in the next five years and beyond. It puts the Philippines in a strategic position to meet the projected increase in demand for halal projects with a supporting policy in place and through the technical assistance of ESMA.

On the part of DTI-PAB, halal accreditation represents a commitment to quality and to reducing risks, addressing health and safety concerns, respecting cultural and individual preferences, and providing the best possible quality of service to the Muslim community. In a fast changing business environment, accreditation has become indispensable for those whom we serve, whether they are consumers, clients, organizations or the general public.
